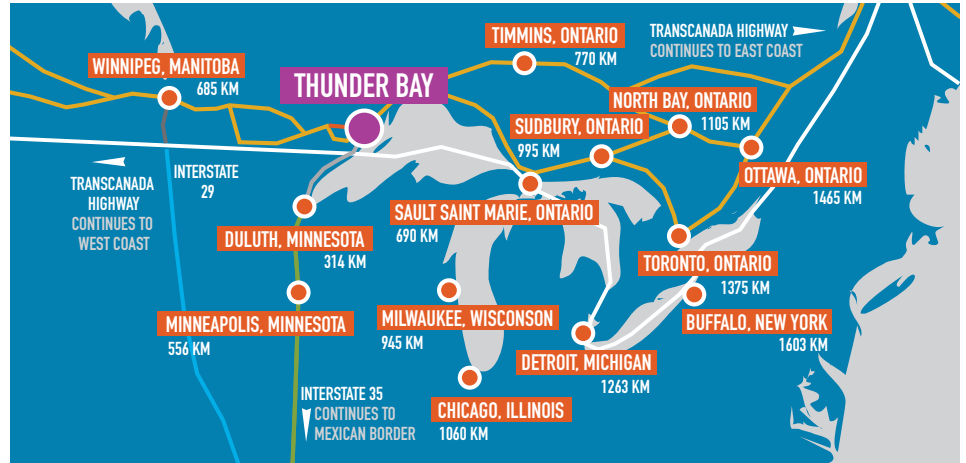

Known as the medical learning and research centre of Northwestern Ontario, Thunder Bay boasts a strong and deep health sciences sector, including patient care centres, a local medical school, and a renowned research institute. Groundbreaking research and innovation at Lakehead University and Thunder Bay Regional Health Sciences Centre also supports a growing medical devices and remote healthcare industry.



Stable and Growing Sector

Jobs in the healthcare and social assistance industry are more highly concentrated in Thunder Bay than in most Canadian cities, and have enjoyed a stable labour supply of educated professionals in recent years.

With a strong outlook as a growth industry, the medical devices and remote healthcare sectors represent a unique and encouraging investment opportunity for both established and burgeoning companies.

Cost Advantages

With a provincial corporate tax rate of 11.5%, and a federal corporate tax rate of 15%, Ontario's combined general federal-provincial CIT rate is lower than the average of G20 countries and the average federal plus state CIT in the United States.

Development Charges

Thunder Bay offers competitive land costs, construction costs, and zero development charges, making it an ideal location for expansion and new construction. The City also has large amounts of land zoned for development.

Skilled Labour Force

Lakehead University offers five undergraduate programs, four master's programs and one doctoral program for students pursuing careers in Health Sciences. Confederation College offers 22 different programs dedicated to Health Sciences. The Northern Ontario School of Medicine has 7 distinct program streams as well as continuing education for health professionals.



Ontario Advantage

Ontario enjoys a universal healthcare system, which means the average employer health costs per year for companies based in Ontario are 1/3 of the cost of the US average. Access to healthcare also raises productivity due to lower rates of absenteeism.

The Government of Ontario invested \$5 million in Lakehead University to create the Centre for Advanced Studies in Engineering and Sciences. A 42,000 square foot facility with new laboratories and equipment to support research and training.

The Government of Canada invested \$1.85 million to enable the Thunder Bay Regional Health Research Institute to purchase equipment and implement new technologies in the area of probe development and bio-marker exploration (PD&BE).



Incentives / Funding Programs

Thunder Bay is committed to supporting the advancement of the medical devices and remote healthcare industry in Northwestern Ontario. There are numerous incentives and funding programs for new and expanding businesses to offset costs and encourage research and innovation.
